
Synchronized Signalized Intersections Top 12 Most Congested Corridors



- **Smart signals technology**, from to monitor traffic flow and reprogram signal timing to respond quicker to changing traffic conditions
 - Upgrading traffic signals with intelligent traffic controller technology
 - o Implementing smart flow detection systems
- Initial deployment along Congestion Management Corridors
 - Intelligent traffic controller technology along with adaptive traffic signal systems and cameras are being deployed along 12 congestion management corridors
 - 1st new signal controllers and adaptive traffic signal system already implemented on NW 36
 Street between Galloway Road and NW 7100 Block
- Transit Signal Priority (TSP) integration for buses
- Reversible lanes
